

Tana Broadbent, from the class of 1966, passed away on January 31, 2024 as the result of a structure fire at her residenence. The following is a published statement from WAFF in Guntersille, Alabama.

GUNTERSVILLE, Ala. (WAFF) - An elderly woman was killed in a structure fire on Wednesday night. The Marshall County Coroner's Office responded to 1341 Point of Pines around 7 p.m. after a body was located by firefighters.

The victim was identified as 75-year-old Tana Broadbent.

The coroner's office said her body was found in a car behind an attached garage.

"It is believed that Ms. Broadbent suffered from a medical episode leading her to drive her vehicle through the back wall of the garage," Marshall County Coroner Cody Nugent said in a news release. "The vehicle suffered damage and it is believed a fuel line on the vehicle was damaged causing the vehicle fire which spread to the garage."

Nugent said there are no signs of foul play.

Guntersville Fire Marshal Matt Lang said the Alabama State Fire Marshall's Office has taken over the investigation to determine the true cause of the fire.

He said, at this time, it is difficult to determine what led up to the events due to the amount of evidence likely destroyed by the fire.

No other information could be found related to a funeral.


